## Principal's Message

The 2007-2008 school is now in full swing. New freshmen are easily navigating the once intimidating halls, moving without delay to the "D wing" or "M building" and settling into the daily life of high school. Our seniors are taking on the role of school leaders while recognizing that their future in college or career is just nine months away. Simply put, the life of Capistrano Valley moves forward much the same as it did 30 years ago when it first opened.

#### **\*\*Deadline and Stipulations for Dropping a Class\*\***

December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2007, is the **final deadline** for students to drop; in order to drop a class, the following criteria **must** be met:

- Students must always be enrolled in the 5-class minimum (for juniors and seniors) or the 6-class minimum for freshman and sophomores. Students may **not** drop a class if it will cause them to fall below the above

limits.

- The dropped class may **not** be a graduation requirement.

A completed blue "Schedule Change Request" form with all necessary signatures is required to drop a class. The form is available in the Guidance Office, or on the CVHS website under "Guidance."
